Real Estate Corner

Report Covers: October 26 – December 31, 2018



A s of December 31, 2018, there were seven homes that are Active listed between \$415,000 and \$980,000. They range from 1,442 square feet to 3,617 square feet – 3/2/2 to 4/4.5/3 and have been on the market between 51 and 354 days. The minimum psf asking price is \$156.64 and the maximum psf asking price is \$371.94. Three of the seven have pools.

There was one Option Pending as of December 31. It was a 3/1.5/2 with 1,425 sq. ft. that had been on the market for 15 days and had a list price of \$379,000.

There was only one closing during this period. It was a 6/3.5/1 with 3,103 sq. ft. on a 10,030 sq. ft. lot with a pool. It was first listed in March 2018 at \$599,900. Subsequently it was listed at \$483,000 on October 31 and after a couple of price reductions sold at \$410,000 in 32 days. (This was not reflected in last newsletter as it was off MLS for two weeks.)

Days on Market: average 217 days


Listing price: average \$459,999 (\$148.24 PSF)
Sale price: average \$410,000 (\$132.13 PSF)

Square footage: average 3,103

Lazybrook Rentals: There are 3 active listings to lease as of December 31. First is a 3/2/2 with 1,429 sq. ft. asking \$2,200. Second is a 3/2/2 with 1,805 sq. ft. asking \$2,490. And the last is a 3/2.5/2 with 2,609 sq. ft. asking \$4,000. The first two have been remodeled and the last was built in 2013.

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
