MOM'S CLUB Erin Palmer Fuchs moms@lazybrook.org Anyone who has walked through the neighborhood lately has noticed that there is an increase in speeding, distracted driving, walking and bicycle riding. There have also been some incidents as a result of the stop signs being ignored. Unfortunately, Millwood has become a cut through between T.C. Jester and 18th Street and speed bumps slow some vehicles down, but not all of them. In response to these concerns Ben Dolan submitted a 311 request to have some of our old and deteriorating signs replaced. Thanks to the City's prompt response we have larger more reflective stop signs at the Millwood and Lazybrook intersection and new speed limit signs on Millwood. The speed limit on Millwood is 20 mph. The speed limit for the rest of the Lazybrook neighborhood at 30 mph. Those speed limits are set by City of Houston ordinances.

Please remember that March is our Membership focus month, don't forget to pay your Civic Club dues! If you have driven down 18th street you will notice the ongoing clean up efforts that are just one of the many things your dues have paid for. I want to thank Beth Goodner for all of her hard work on helping with and organizing the clean up efforts.

ear Lazybrook neighboors,

For the past several months we have experienced irregularity in our trash and recyling pick-up due to factors with the City outside our control. Now that the City is back on track, we thought this would be a good time to remind everyone of the bluk trash, yard waste, and weekly trash and recyling guidelines and schudle.

Our collection day is Thursday, with recycling bins every other week. The city will not pick up items in the weekly collection such as boxes or bags left with the bins with one exception only--the weekly yard waste collection. Yard waste must be either in special approved City of Houston bags available at grocery and hardware stores, or cut into 3 foot lengths and tied into bundles.

There is also the Heavy Trash collection on each third Wednesday of every month. You may begin putting out items on the weekend before. On even months, such as April, you may put out your "junk trash" such as old furniture, and also "tree waste" such as limbs of trees and shrubbery.

On odd months, they collect only "tree waste."

Do not mix junk and tree materials, as they go into separate trucks. They will not pick up bagged trash (other than the weekly yard waste in special bags).

To help you keep on top of this, the schdule is listed on the back page of this Newsletter in the calendar





As of March 4, 2019, there were ten homes that are Active listed between \$405,000 and \$980,000. They range from 1,442 square feet to 3,617 square feet – 3/1.5/1 to 4/4.5/3 and have been on the market between 18 and 3200 days. The minimum psf asking price is \$214.28 and the maximum psf asking price is \$359.33. Three of the ten have pools.

There were four Pending as of March 4. Asking prices start at \$435,000 and top out at \$849,000 for a new construction. Size range from 1,644 square feet to 2,850 square feet configured as 3/2/2 to a 4/3.5/2

Four properties closed during this period; selling from \$362,000 to \$585,000. Two of the four have pools and the remarkable stat is that they were on the market for 3,4,5 and 15 days before going under contract.

Lazybrook Rentals:

There are 4 active listings to lease as of March 4. They range in price from \$2,295 to \$2,995 and have been on market between 14 and 119 days. Three properties leased during this period. Smallest was 1,429 square feet, a 3/2/2 that leased for \$2,200 to a 3/2.5/2 with 2609 square feet built in 2013 that leased for \$3,700. The average days on market for the leased properties was 36 days.

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

The restaurant was purchased in 2000. They were very nice but busy getting ready to do business. Since both of us were just getting started we agreed I should check back for the next Civic Club meeting. Then of course I did go back two months later for the next meeting. Since then I have seen the Restaurant go thru many changes and I have collected 98 donations for the Lazybrook Civic Club from them. Kathryn doesn't work at Kojak's now but Mark is there every morning usually delivering catering which has really grown for the Restaurant.

The staff at Kojak's is eager to fill special requests and special diets. All you have to do is ask. It is Homestyle cooking in a casual setting. You can order on line and they will also deliver orders. They were closed in the evening for several years but are now open to include dinner from 7:30am – 9:00pm Monday thru Friday. Beer and Wine is available now with TV's overhead to watch the big game and have a quick bite to eat. Gelato is also a new favorite. This doesn't leave out the children---in fact, on Monday and Wednesday night kids eat free.

If you have eaten there you know the food is good and you will usually see some of your neighbors eating or picking up food. It is a good gathering place and they always make you feel welcome. I have personally used the catering several times and I have never been disappointed. After 18 years I feel we are friends and I was thrilled to see daughter Sydney helping Dad out in the evening.
