ould you like to help keep our neighborhood safe? Citizen Patrol successfully brings together communities and police for a common goal; improving the quality of life for residents by preventing, reducing, or eliminating crime.

You can make a big difference reducing crime in our area by patrolling just a few hours per month. Patrolling can be as easy as cruising your car through our neighborhood and calling in suspicious persons, vehicles, or activity to our local HPD. Patrollers are **reimbursed \$\$\$ per hour driven** on their beat and get cool Lazybrook **Patrol signs** for their car while on duty in our Lazybrook Neighborhood.

We would like to hold a **training session for new members.**Training is conducted by HPD at Lazybrook Baptist Church and takes no more than an hour.

Report Covers: August 16 – October 25, 2018



s of October 25, there are three homes that are Active listed between \$324,900 and \$625,000. They range from 1,521 square feet to 2,372 square feet -3/1/2 to 4/2.5/2 and have been on the market between 1 and 70 days. The minimum psf asking price is \$213.61 and the maximum psf asking price is \$394.07.

There are seven Pending or Option Period Pending as of October 25. These properties range from 1,622 to 2,777 square feet offered from \$429,900 to \$759,000. These went under contract between 5 and 339 total days on market.

Between August 16 and October 25 there were ten closings in Lazybrook. The lowest sales price was \$309,611 for a 2/2 with 1,479 square feet that was on the market for 18 days. The highest was a 4/2.5/2 with 2,039 square feet that sold at \$595,000. The shortest time from listing to accepted contract was 4 days – the longest was 284 days. Five sellers contributed to Buyers closing costs from \$1,500 to \$6,000. One seller contributed \$735 for repairs. All Sellers paid for the Owners'Title policy.

Stats for sales:

Days on Market: average 77 days

Listing price: average \$476,080 (\$251.64 PSF)
Sale price: average \$463,461 (\$245.30 PSF)

Square footage: average 1,911

Lazybrook Rentals: Three rentals closed during those this period. They were on the market from 8 to 52 days, 1,718 square feet to 1,924 square feet and leased from \$2,000 to \$2,795 per month. As of October 25, there was one property actively for lease. It is a 3/1.5/2 with 1,413 square feet offered at \$1,895.

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

Parents Night - White Elephant Gift Exchange


