#### **Council Member Ellen Cohen Comes Through for Jaycee Park!**

Thanks to Council Member Ellen Cohen, Silver Eagle Distributors on Washington donated \$3,000 to fund a much requested amenity for Jaycee Park that was installed at the ballfield's Grovewood/Seamist corner on December 6, just in time for the TMCC's Winter Festival.

At the request of both the Timbergrove Manor Civic Club (TMCC) and the Super Neighborhood 14 Council (SNC-14), CM Cohen has consistently and strongly advocated for this amenity for our park for over two years with the Houston Parks & Recreation Department.



When the private renovation ended in 2012, our transformed park attracted more people who were staying longer than had been the case in decades. The splash pad began attracting families with small children many of whom were yet to be potty trained; the City began programming the tennis courts with some lessons lasting two hours; Grovewood, Seaspray and Foxwood residents reported being bothered and inconvenienced in various ways because our park had no restroom facilities.

At the TMCC's May 13 meeting regarding the park's Capital Improvement Project (CIP) funds, many of you spoke up and requested a restroom facility or at least porto-potty units. **Lisa Johnson**, the Parks Program Manager, clearly said no to a restroom facility. Several weeks later, CM Cohen's office was informed that no funds could be diverted from the CIP for porto-potty units because the CIP is a finite amount and porto-potty units involve ongoing maintenance.

Refusing to take no for an answer, CM Cohen and her staff pursued another avenue, secured the private donation from Silver Eagle Distributors, asked the Timbergrove Manor Civic Club to accept the donation and obtain the two units for the park.

Because the TMCC heard a clear mandate from residents at the May 13 and the September 9 general meetings, the TMCC accepted CM Cohen's request and contracted with Payless Porta Jons to install two units and service them one time per week. However, this private, designated donation is ONLY FOR ONE YEAR. The units will be removed in December 2015 unless another private donor comes forward or the TMCC receives an increase in dues to continue to provide this amenity for Jaycee Park.

Per the TMCC's contract with Payless Porta Jons, the units will be serviced once per week, currently on Wednesdays. If any teams, groups, event and party hosts want an extra cleaning, those arrangements and payment must be between them and Payless Porta Jons ((832) 370-4409) and will not involve the TMCC.

In the upcoming months, the TMCC will need your feedback and support in deciding if, after a year: 1) we have a mandate from dues paying residents to continue to fund the units and 2) we have the funds to do so. #### **School Zone Safety**

As a volunteer for Citizens on Patrol and a regular morning walker, I often see drivers using a cell phone or texting while driving through our school zone on Ella Boulevard or crossing our school zone on Grovewood.

Google "Distracted Driving" and you will get facts, figures and stats from all kinds of sources: TX DOT, AAA, the Federal Highway Administration, Stop Texts Stop Wrecks. Bottom line: **using a cell phone while driving is extremely dangerous and accidents happen in a split second.** 

Per www.distraction.gov, "Because text messaging requires visual, manual, and cognitive attention from the driver, it is by far the most alarming distraction."

Using a cell phone to talk or text is especially dangerous in a school zone. As you know, traffic in the Ella/Grovewood area is heavy in the mornings and in the afternoons and "traffic" ranges from walkers and bike riders to subcompact cars to SUVs, vans and school buses. Children are small and hard to see.

In October, I spoke to Sinclair's crossing guard and she told me that unfortunately it is very common to see drivers talking on cell phones and see drivers with their eyes downcast not looking ahead while driving through the school zone. And this happens when the lights are flashing and even when she blows her whistle and raises her crossing guard sign to get children across the street!

Safety is the main concern and goal. Also, Texas has banned the use of handheld phones and texting in school zones. So, please refrain from this dangerous practice in our school zone, and remind others to do the same, for safety sake and also to comply with Texas state law.



I spend every New Year's Eve reviewing my goals and writing down my top 10 accomplishments. So one of my colleagues put together some great facts that I hope we all can use to help us focus on getting better sleep.\*

# Don't skimp on slumber if you want to be as healthy as you can be.

According to the National Sleep Foundation, most healthy adults need 7-9 hours of sleep a night. If you consistently fall short of this goal, you may be increasing your risk for obesity, cognitive impairment, a compromised immune system and much more.

In 2011 Harvard scientists estimated that sleep deprivation costs U.S. Companies \$63.2 billion in lost productivity per year.

In one study, middle-aged and older adults who reported 5 hours of sleep or less were 2.5 times more likely to have diabetes, compared with those who slept 7-8 hours per night.

Several studies have found that sleep deprivation raises blood pressure. Half a night of sleep loss has been reported to increase blood pressure in people with hypertension or prehypertension.

When exposed to the cold-causing rhinovirus, study subjects averaging less than 7 hours of sleep a night were about three times more likely to develop cold symptoms than study volunteers who slept 8 or more hours a night.

Insufficient sleep decreases the number of genes that peak and fall in expression during a 24 - hour period from 1,855 to 1,481. Less than 6 hours of sleep a night affects more than 700 genes.

Sleeping 5 hours or less may increase mortality risk from all causes by roughly 15%.

I hope these facts help give you the desire to get and work on getting better quality rest. Here are my top 5 suggestions for improved sleep!

- 1. Exercise. It helps you relax! (To the right are 5 great exercises)
- **2. Some form of relaxation.** I meditate regularly and it has helped not only my sleep but it has increased my energy.
- 3. I create my day every morning. I do that by asking my self "what is the greatest ideal of myself". The person I don't want to be (negative or pessimistic) and the person I do want to be (happy, joyous and balanced).





#### WARM-UP - 1 Forward / Backward


Spread legs wider than shoulders. Stretch hands overhead, slight back arch. Reach between legs as far as possible. Return. Keep movement constant: 2 count down 2 count up. Do not static hold at top or bottom.






#### WARM-UP - 6 Arm Circle: Lateral

Athletic stance. Arms out to sides. Small circles forward then backward; progress to larger circles.






#### WARM-UP - 8 Sideways Walk With Squat

Start in athletic stance. Side step to <u>right</u> and drop hips. Head and chest up, shin vertical. Lunge foot pointing forward. Lift from hips and back foot to standing position. Repeat in walking motion in same direction.


Do <u>2</u> sets <u>8</u> reps. Do reps both ways for one set.



WARM-UP - 11 Arms Walk Out and Back

Stand erect. Bend at waist and touch floor. Walk hands out to push up position. Head up, back and legs straight. Walk hands backward to start position.


Do <u>2</u> sets <u>8</u> reps.

At the January 27th meeting, there will again be a vote on whether to ask the city to mow the rest of the park area along the bayou on West T.C.Jester.

I feel I do not need to repeat all the reasons why the majority of Lazybrook residents have voted in the past to leave the area without mowing. I will just mention that mowing kills species that promote bees and butterflies, kills baby trees, and removes grasses that slow rain run-off and help prevent flooding. Also, if you think homeless people will go away if there is mowing, I would like to point out they are here because of the shelter under the bridges, and because they gather food from the unlocked dumpsters at the area stores and restaurants.

I would like to ask those of you who want to mow to consider that all of the rest of the Lazybrook areas are cut on a regular basis. This includes the esplanades, the bayou banks and the park area along West T.C.Jester from Ella all the way to near Lazybrook Drive. The ONLY area that is not cut is from Lazybrook to 610, and even that area is cut along the bayou pathway, along the curb, and at the paths crossing the area at each Lazybrook street. Is it really too much for you to allow this small area to be left alone? Is there no really no room for compromise here? Thanks for your consideration.


