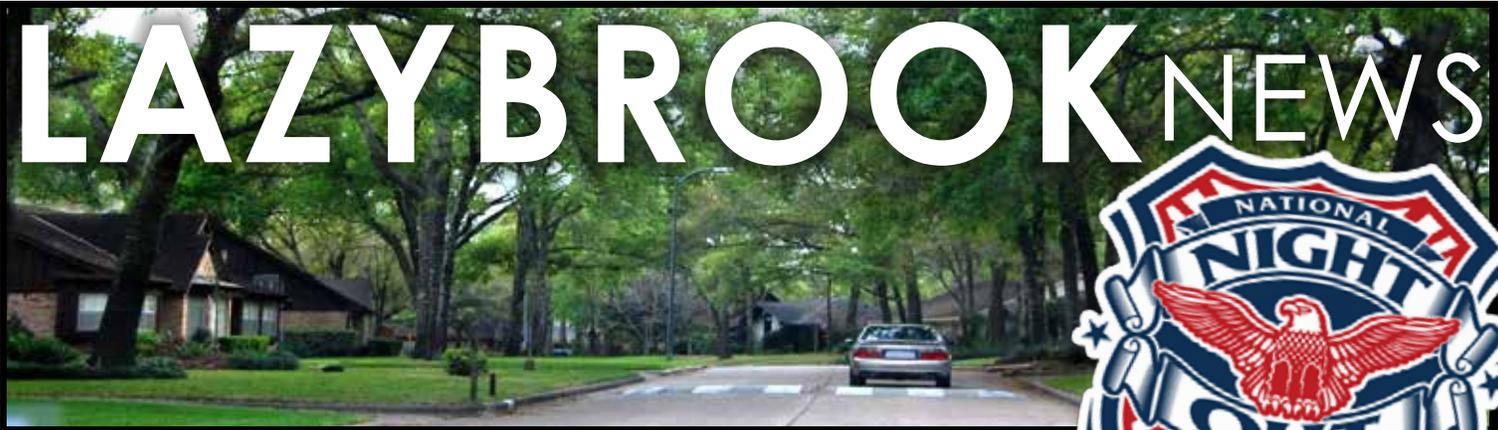

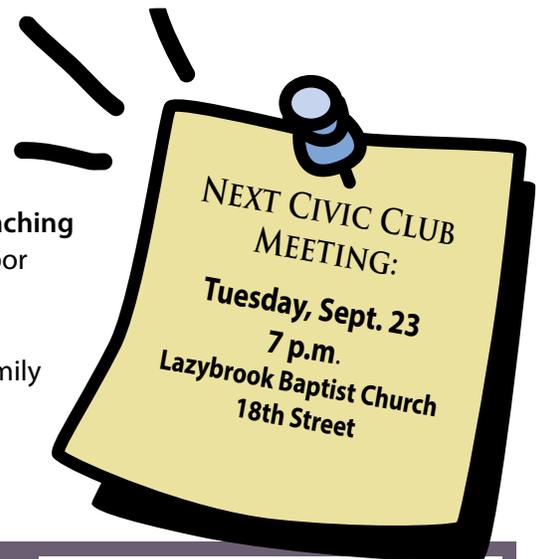
President's Letter

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Jaycee Park Update

Welcome back to Houston, **Aimee Barlow** and family! In 2009 when Ileana Desalos began canvassing and organizing the neighborhoods to renovate Jaycee Park, Aimee Barlow was one of the first residents to step up and put forth a lot of work and time toward the effort.

Although partnered with Houston Parks Board, a large portion of the private funds raised for the revitalization came from the efforts of local volunteers like Aimee. Aimee designed the early flyers and created the Facebook page to get news out to the neighborhoods about meetings and fundraisers. Under Ileana's overall supervision, Aimee organized volunteers for the first coin drive, our first event which raised about \$10,000, showed Houston Parks Board we were serious and snowballed into other volunteers coming onboard.



In 2010, even with the news that her husband's work would take their family overseas for at least three years, Aimee helped plan two future fundraisers, one of which was our second coin drive that September. With a million things to do to get ready for their move, Aimee still found time to walk blocks to raise funds for the park.



This past July 4th for the Ice Cream Social that was held in Jaycee Park, we needed a leader for the parade. Although they had only been back in their house for a few days, Aimee's husband and son, **Darren** and **Wilson**, generously volunteered. Wilson is a boy scout with Troop 40. Daughter **Avery** is an accomplished equestrienne and animal lover. So, welcome back to Jaycee Park supporters Aimee & Darren and Wilson & Avery Barlow.

That's a bit of recent history about the private fundraising effort that took place from 2009-2012.

We've had a good summer for the trees, since there was adequate rain. No artificial watering was necessary. Hooray!

Trees for Houston has received a donation for planting trees on 18th Street from Seamist to 610. I met with their representative in early June to discuss this. They asked for input about the project. I said we would like to avoid removing anything, preferring to fill in spots with trees that do not grow to be very large. This seemed agreeable. Trees for Houston will provide all materials and labor and will care for the trees, including watering, for two years. Work will be done in November .

Since May 1, 2014 there have been 13 sales; the average time on market was 24 days.

As of August 31, 2014 we have 2 homes that are Active listed at \$459,900 and \$699,000. The listing at \$459,900 is a 3/2/2 with 2,035 square feet and the other is a 4/3.5/2 with 3,297 square feet on an oversized lot with a pool.

There are 5 properties Pending and scheduled to close before September 30. Listed prices range from \$374,900 to \$622,000 and are between 1,546 and 2,480 square feet.

Lazybrook had thirteen closings between May 1 and August 31 asking prices ranged from \$298,000 to \$629,000 and the sales prices ranged from \$293,000 to \$623,400.

Average time on the market: 24 days (Minimum 4 day, Maximum 128)

Average Asking Price: \$440,708

Average Per Square Foot Asking: \$241.30

Average Sales Price: \$436,143

Average Per Square Foot Sales Price: \$239.44

Average Square Feet: 1,862, 3 bedrooms, 2.5 baths

Nine were conventional loans, two sold for cash and one was an FHA loan. Three sellers contributed to buyers' closing cost (\$1500-\$4493), these numbers are not reflected in the sales price.

Lazybrook Rentals: As of September 1 two Lazybrook home are listed for lease. There is a 2/1 listed at \$2,000 and a 4/2 asking \$2500.

Between May and August 31 seven properties leased from \$1,995 and \$2,995. The average time on the market before a lease was signed was 40 days.
