People live in Lazybrook because it is one of the few places remaining in Houston where yards, both front and back, still can be found and it's the Civic Club responsibility to ensure that remains the case. The primary way we oversee our deed restrictions is through our Architectural Review and Deed Restriction Committee. This Committee reviews all remodeling plans and monitors activity in the neighborhood to ensure that the deed restrictions are followed. In recent years, we have had challenges keeping this committee staffed and completing the required reviews. This past month, I invited interested residents to my home to discuss the best path forward for the committee. There was much discussion around responsibilities and how best to move forward in the future. We have some internal tasks to complete, but are looking forward to presenting that path in the May Civic Club meeting so be sure to attend.

With the warmer weather, it has been nice to see neighbors out in their yards and along the bayou these past few weeks. The bluebonnets were beautiful this year and I do hope that you and yours had an opportunity to enjoy them. Again, continued on page 4

Summer is coming, and so are the Door-to-door Home Security Salesmen

Houston, TX- Across the nation, companies are utilizing eager & gullible college students to peddle their products and services with the allure of experience for their resume and promises of wealth. We have all heard the knock at the door with anticipation of a friendly neighbor saying hi or a delivery of your most recent online shopping purchase. Instead it's a young salesmen saying whatever he can to get you to sign up for his service. There's the guy selling books or magazine you will more than likely never see. There's the guy trying to switch over your electricity or cable provider. Then there's the guy trying to get you to sign up or switch over your home security service. Precautions such as these are put in place by the state to ensure the safety of its residents. Upon being approved and licensed, each Alarm Salesperson receives an Identification Card from the state that looks almost identical to a Driver's License. Odds are that the guy knocking on your door works for a company that has not taken the time to get him an individual license. For this reason, homeowners should be wary of the friendly college student who is here for a "summer internship" to "advertise" home security. Ask to see his Alarm Salesperson license. If he does not have it, do not let them in your home. And to save your neighbors from the misery, pick up the phone and call the proper authorities.

The next thing to consider is the trap that most of these companies put people in. The products and services they offer may be an upgrade to what you have, but you're going to pay for it one way or another. The most common way these door-to-door companies operate is to offer no upfront cost and often times giving your first couple months for free. Before you know it, these door-to-door alarm salesmen swindle homeowners into 5-year contracts with costs as high as \$65-70 per month. What most people don't realize is they can be signing a contract committing them to over \$4,000! How "FREE" is a new home security system if you're required to pay that company \$4,000 or more over the course of the next 5 years?



Since January 1, 2014 there have been 7 sales; the average time on market was 19 days.

As of May 1, 2014 we have 6 homes that are either Active, Option Pending or Pending Continue to Show ranging in price from \$299,500 for a 3/1.5/2 original condition to \$629,000 for a 3/2.5/2 new construction.

Lazybrook had seven closings between January 1 and April 30 asking prices ranged from \$299,000 to \$590,000 and the sales prices ranged from \$321,500 to \$590,000. Yes, the property listed for \$299,000 was sold for more than asking price.

Average Asking Price: \$425,486 Average Per Square Foot Asking: \$247.19

All seven were conventional loans. One of the properties had a repair allowance of \$15,590; two had Seller contributions for closing costs (\$1,000 - \$4,500). These numbers are not reflected in the sales price.

Lazybrook Rentals: As of May 1, three Lazybrook home are listed for lease. Prices range from \$2,250 to \$2,995.

Between January 1 and April 30 three Lazybrook properties were leased for between \$1,950 and \$2,490. The average time on the market before a lease was signed was 30 days.
