## Membership

ur March Membership Drive is in full swing! Now is a great time to share your neighborhood pride by becoming a dues-paying member of the Lazybrook Civic Club for 2022. The LCC plays an important part in caring for our little corner of Houston, and its work is only possible with the annual support of members like you.

Your voluntary payment of \$40 helps the LCC:

- Beautify the neighborhood by mowing and cleaning next to the fences on 18th street, maintaining esplanade trees, and restoring neighborhood entry markers;
- Enhance neighborhood security through Citizen Patrol;
- Enforce deed restrictions and architectural review of home renovations and construction;
- Work with Super Neighborhood Council 14 and other city and county entities to ensure our neighborhood is maintained and improved;
- Keep residents current on information that affects our neighborhood;
- Form committees for yard-of-the-month, holiday judging, and bayou litter pick-ups etc.; and
- Battle those pesky mosquitos with weekly spraying in March through November.

Please help the LCC do even more in 2022 by joining. So far this year, membership includes just **35.5%** of the neighborhood. That's a good start, but let's make this a banner year!

Our neighbors in the 2000-2100 block of Seamist have set a great example with 80% of households joining the LCC. And in the 2000-2100 block of Millwood, 53.3% of households have joined. Way to go! I hope to announce in our next newsletter that other blocks have similar participation rates.

As always, thank you for your new and continued support of the LCC. Special thanks also to Eddie Yarborough for her years of service as the LCC membership committee chair and to our wonderful block captains for their help with the March membership drive.

## **Capital Improvements Update**


e are well underway on many of our capital improvement initiatives and have many progress updates to share with our neighbors. We will cover these at our next regularly scheduled meeting, but wanted to share the following highlights:

**18th Street Panel Replacements** - A walk-through is scheduled for March 18th with SN-14, City of Houston Public Works, and Abbie Kamin's office to review and prioritize individual concrete panels on 18th St that are in need of replacement

**Lazybrook Street Repair** - A full list of high priority Lazybrook neighborhood street repair needs have been compiled by Shelley White and Josh Chaffin, which is being shared with Houston Public Works on Mar 18th and will be followed up with a formal repair request via 311 and our contacts at the HPW office.

Lazybrook Decorative Street Sign Toppers-Designs are currently being finalized. We are working with the city to get a formal approval for installation at all neighborhood entrances. One example of a design being worked is shown below. A big thanks to Michael Morton for helping drive this initiative's design phase!

**Pedestrian Safety for Lazybrook** - Public Works application has been submitted complete sidewalks along Millwood Dr; we will continue to work other initiatives including safer pedestrian crossing(s) at 18th and/or TC Jester, bike lanes, and more.



We are still working this year as well on additional speed cushion installations, radar/speed limit signs, and more. Stop by the next meeting to learn more, or email <u>improvements@lazybrook.org</u> if you have any other ideas or want to help out with an initiative.

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## **Volunteering to Make a Difference**

Larly last year, after two years of behind the scenes push and pull with the city, with help from our council member, Abbie Kamin, and the blessing of Houston City Council, a group of local volunteers from TMCC, TMNA, LCC, and SN 14 were able to accomplish a big task. Pete Davies and John Zavala of Timbergrove Manor Civic Club, Tim Hassett and Leigh Kilgore of Timbergrove Manor Neighborhood Association, and all of them working with Super Neighborhood 14, got 18 street concrete panel sections replaced (NOT repaired) along W18th Street (east bound) between loop 610 W and Seamist Drive. This is considered Phase I of the project.

Recently, this same group, along with the new president of Lazybrook Civic Club, Kurt Swafford, submitted a request for Phase II to continue street panel replacements from Seamist Drive to Ella Blvd on the east bound side of 18th Street.

This same group's request, made in the summer of 2020, to address a terrible section of W11th street between Shelterwood and Bryce on the west bound side, for a Phase III Street Panel Replacement Project, is scheduled to be completed this year!

Without the help of these hard working volunteers, this wouldn't have happened in our neighborhoods. These



accomplishments happen not only because the volunteers work hard, but they happen because they work together. TMCC, TMNA, LCC, and SN14 all want the same thing: to work for the greater good of our neighborhoods and residents. That's because they are residents here themselves.

Our civic clubs give our volunteers the ability to connect with and hear their neighbors' concerns, and then work to connect with other local civic clubs to make a difference in the neighborhood.

Our city leaders are also residents of our neighborhoods and are dedicated to working for our city. However, without our local civic club volunteers, the city leaders will never know exactly what needs to be addressed where in the city.

Right now, we are all very concerned about not only the condition of our streets, but also about our storm water systems. But, did you know that there is a study in the works to find out where to correct the worst problems because TMCC, TMNA, LCC and SN14 all worked together to get that study going? These concerns won't just fix themselves, nor will our busy city leaders and council members just show up and start repairing things they have nothing to do. They need our local volunteers to alert them to these problems.

We are very thankful to Abbie Kamin and her staff, as well as the folks at Public Works for their dedication to these projects. The good work they do is invaluable to our projects.

But, you also can be a part of these important projects! Or maybe you have a project that you feel needs to be brought to the table. The first step is to become a member of Lazybrook Civic Club. Then, go one step further - become a volunteer in LCC. That's the way it all starts and that's the way it happens. There is room for you at the table and LCC is the way to find your seat.

This report covers the period of January 15, 2021 – March 5, 2022

The Houston housing market forecasts that home values will continue to rise in 2022 with a high number of home sales. The market is likely to cool down compared to 2021, but it will still be very active. We expect First-time home buyer demand to increase and suburbs to be the fastest growing market with the demand increase for bigger homes.

Our Lazybrook neighborhood continues to be active with new listings, sales and remodels. The neighborhood mostly features midsize homes that are competitively priced. The community dates back to 1955 and has continued to develop over the years. The house ages range from 1955 to 2020 with already 11 homes sold this year.

#### **ACTIVE HOMES**

As of March 5, 2022, there are five homes actively listed in Lazybrook – priced between \$435,000 and \$759,900. The square footage ranges from 1,398 to 2,023 and built between 1955 and 1964. The homes range from 3 bedrooms 2 baths with an average dollar per SQFT of \$333.75 to a 3 bedrooms 2/1 baths with an average dollar per SQFT of \$343.40. The average list price is \$613,780 with a days on market of 40.

#### **PENDING HOMES**

Two Lazybrook properties are under contract: selling between \$589,900 and \$899,000 with square footage ranging from 2120 to 3685 SQFT. The average dollar per SQFT for these pending properties is \$261.10 with a days on market of 107.


