We really enjoyed seeing all our neighbors at this year's neighborhood-wide National Night Out event. The turnout was great, and we got tons of positive feedback from everyone who made it out to the festivities. If you didn't make it, come see us next time---we look forward to doing it again next year. Thanks, Megan Mooney for driving the bus and planning the event this year!

As will be highlighted in the newsletter in our Beautification article, 2022 has been a huge year for progress in and around the neighborhood. Between esplanade tree pruning, new and repaired Lazybrook signage and land-scaping cleanups, LCC has paid for nearly \$12k in beautification projects this year. Thanks Vennie and Renee for all your hard work!

As discussed and voted on at our last regular meeting, the time has come to raise our annual dues to \$60, with a "senior discount" \$40 rate available for residents 65+ yrs of age. This little bit of extra cash flow will allow us to do a thorough job of maintaining what we have, as well as handle any large routine maintenance projects (planned or unplanned) that may come up down the road. Discussion and vote on the dues topic will resume at our next meeting on Nov 29, and a second vote will be held as required in our bylaws to make the new rate effective in 2023. The Vice President role is currently vacant, and we can always use help on our other committees and roles to lighten the load of our volunteers.

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
Beautification Update

2022 has been a busy year for beautification and maintience efforts!

Two of our esplanade signs were in a complete state of disrepair and needed replacing, we are happy to say that the new ones are installed and look fantasitc!

Our metal work signs and brick walls along 18th Street were in despreate need of repair and recoating, we can happily say that is all now complete and our freshly coated signs are in the process of being re-installed as we publish this newsletter.

Our TC Jester Esplanade was long over due for a major pruning, it was looking unkept and messy to say the least. After working with the COH and Urban Foresty, we were able to aquire the permits to do a major pruning of all the ornamental tress between 610 and Ella Blvd. Things are looking much improved!



We hope to utlize our relationship with Urban Forestry, Trees for Houston and potentally the neighborhood matching grants program to fund and complete the planting of some large species native hardwoods along with irrigation in 2023 for some of the more sparse looking areas, for example, the section of esplanade between Lazybrook Dr and Brooktree Dr.

Lastly, we plan to continue to maintain and improve the landscaping around our signs. A huge shout out to Ed and Renee Taylor for taking on a clean-up around the sign near spagethii western recently, it was much needed. If you are interested in volunteering to help out with future plantings, light landscape clean-up efforts through the year or any beautification efforts please email beautification@lazybrook.org and we will be in touch. Our goal is to get a committee of volunteers to help spread out the burden of coordination and keep things looking good throughout the year.

Super Neighborhood-14 Update

f you've heard someone tossing around the term Super Neighborhood 14, you might not know what they are talking about and you might be afraid you will look silly asking what it is. Timbergrove Manor Neighborhood Association (TMNA) consists of Sections 1 - 4 of Timbergrove Manor and is on the east side of TC Jester Blvd. Timbergrove Manor Civic Club (TMCC) consists of Sections 5 - 14 of Timbergrove Manor and is on the west side of TC Jester Blvd. And, Lazybrook Civic Club (LCC) contains the neighborhood of Lazybrook, which shares boundaries with both TMNA and TMCC. Together, the three neighborhoods make Super Neighborhood 14 (SN14). Because of the close proximity of the neighborhoods, working together is much more effective than working alone. You might not know that Houston Super Neighborhood 14 now has a Facebook page. If you are on Facebook, like the page. It has the most up-to-date information of what is happening in Super Neighborhood 14 in real time, as it has additions to it daily and you will be "in the know" as to how the neighborhoods are working together. Recently, SN14 has had a lot going on.

The most visible progress can be seen in the ongoing street and sidewalk repairs and replacements, with crews currenty working hard here in Lazybrook. In August, Harris County Precinct 4 Commissioner Jack Cagle announced the Super Neighborhood 14 Community Project. The approximate \$5M effort funded by Harris County Precinct 4 is a partnership project with the Super Neighborhood 14 Community and the City of Houston to bring rapid response to constituent concerns regarding neighborhood mobility issues. The project began in September and consists of concrete street panel replacements and repairs, asphalt repairs, sidewalk repairs and ADA ramps installations. The project began in area A-1 (pictured below) and is estimated to be substantially complete by January, 2023, with exception of Grovewood Lane between Ella Blvd and TC Jester Blvd which will need to be completed after the school year. The project does not include any work on the major thoroughfares.

To kick off the new school year, SN14 celebrated the new Sinclair SPARK walking trail, and highlighted multi-modal safety in our area. Super Neighborhood 14 invited all members of our community as well as members of our neighboring Super Neighborhoods, to Walk, Bike & Roll to Sinclair Elementary for an afternoon of fun.

A good crowd showed up and showed off their bike and scooter skills. Everyone also had a chance to check out and sit in emergency vehicles and learn about how local transportation initiatives affect our community. Texas State Representative Ann Johnson, Harris County Precinct 4 Commissioner Jack Cagle, Houston District C Council Member Abbie Kamin, HISD Trustee Bridget Wade, Houston Public Works, Houston Transportation Planning, the Houston Police Department, and the Houston Fire Department were all in attendance.

In a Multi-modal Forum, representatives from Metro, Texas Department of Transportation, Bike Houston, Houston Parks Board, the Houston-Galveston Area Council, and the City of Houston Planning Department presented transportation changes coming to Timbergrove Manor.

Safe Routes to School Grant - An application for pedestrian accessibility to schools, parks, mass transit, etc. centered on Centerpoint Easements will be submitted this year. Please submit any areas of concern that you have to the following link which the City will use to prioritize funding:

Recently, Tours by elected officials have been made to highlight our community needs to those who represent us. Lizzie Fletcher is our United States Representative for District 7 and Dr. Tina Pederson is the Harris County Flood Control District's Executive Director. Both of them were able to tour specific areas of concern within our community including flood prone areas, streets lacking adequate sidewalks or bike lanes, and areas of rapid, dense development as well as identifying green space that can be used for parks, trails, and bike paths to improve mobility within Super Neighborhood 14. It was really wonderful to have them take the time to come to tour.

Lorraine Cherry Nature Preserve News

Our Calendar Year Draws to a Close Friends of The Lorraine Cherry Nature Preserve sponsors weekly **Bird Walks** in the Forest each Tuesday morning at 8:00 am from now until December 13. We will take the last 2 weeks of December and the first week of January off so that we can participate in the many Christmas Bird Counts happening in our area. Meet at the kiosk on Shelterwood across from the corner of Pineshade. Dress for the weather, wear comfortable shoes, and bring your bug spray and water. If you have binoculars, it really adds to the experience to have them with you. If you hear thunder, the Bird Walk will be cancelled until the following week.

Injured Birds or Animals at the Nature Preserve

One question that is asked fairly frequently is, "What will I do if I see an injured bird or animal at the Nature Preserve?" The best answer is, take a photo and make a phone call. Please do not try to rescue a bird or an an-

imal without asking a wildlife expert first. In the fall of 2020, there was a fledgling Great Horned Owl spotted in the Nature Preserve on the ground. A neighbor thought they were helping, trapping the fledgling in a box, and taking it to the Wildlife Center of Texas. However, there was nothing at all wrong with the fledgling. Often, if owl, or hawk, fledglings are on the ground, they are learning, like a toddler. Did you know that fledgling owls have hooks on their talons so that they can climb trees to get away from danger? And, that they can fly, too? Removing that fledgling from the Nature Preserve, no matter how kind heartedly, removed it from its owl parents. They lost their fledgling that day and they left their nest in the Nature Preserve immediately. The owl parents learned that our Nature Preserve was not a safe place to raise the fledgling. And, although we have heard and seen (even seen sleeping) Great Horned Owls since, we haven't seen a Great Horned Owl nest in the

Nature Preserve since. Taking a photo and calling the Wildlife Center (713-861-9453) BEFORE you attempt to help a bird or animal that you perceive to be in distress will save you from potentially taking the wrong action.

Wireless Wilderness

The Wireless Wilderness is completely refreshed to reflect the name change of the Nature Preserve. But, it's more than just new signage - we've added a couple of stations to it as well. Besides the dial up access, the Wireless Wilderness now has scannable QR codes which give you access to the new recordings as well as more photos. The next time you are in the Nature Preserve, look for the new signage, all of which is located on the main loop of the trail, and listen to a station or two.

Please, come visit the forest soon!
