Letter From The President

Dear Lazybrook,

Looking back, 2022 certainly proved to be one of the biggest years ever here in our neighborhood. Last year we spent \$12k on the beautification front alone, with new signs, brick sign repairs, landscape cleanups, esplanade pruning and more. In an even bigger development, Harris County stepped up and heard our complaints about our crumbling streets, coming to the rescue with street and sidewalk repairs to the tune of \$5-mil. We expect this work to wrap up in the next few months. Thanks to former Commissioner Cagle and current/new commissioner Briones for funding and continuing this great work in our area!

Looking ahead at 2023, there are certainly plenty of opportunities to keep up the momentum and improve our area even more. This includes: 1) New tree plantings on our esplanades funded by Dept of Neighborhoods grant, Trees for Houston, LCC, 2) Refresh of our esplanade sign landscape beds with some fresh plants, mulch. We also still have the opportunity to pursue traffic/speeding mitigation efforts on Millwood, Watercrest which is a much larger scale project that will take a much longer time to pull together.

One topic that will be on our January meeting agenda is whether or not to continue the mosquito spraying program in 2023. LCC has done spraying since 2014, when a large contingent of neighbors at the time who wanted to start a spraying program attended a meeting and forced a vote on the issue. Based on feedback from our last regular meeting when this topic came up for discussion, there remains very little interest amongst our membership to continue this program. Of course, as mosquito spraying is part of our operating budget, suspending this program requires 2/3 majority vote at any regular meeting. If you have strong interest in continuing or stopping spraying or otherwise wish to have input, please pay your dues, show up to the January meeting, and be prepared to vote on/discuss the matter.

Thank you in advance for your support this year as we try to not only continue improving Lazybrook, but keep things looking great for years to come.

Lt is the start of a new year for membership in the Lazybrook Civic Club. We finished last year with our highest membership rate in recent years (60%). Thank you!! Please help us keep that momentum going in 2023 by renewing your LCC membership or joining us for the first time. As we saw last year with the many beautification and capital improvement projects in the neighborhood, the LCC plays an important part in caring for our little corner of Houston. But we can't do it without you.

Please recall that our voluntary dues have increased this year to \$60 (still \$40 for neighbors aged 65 and up). Your voluntary dues payment allows the LCC to:

- beautify the neighborhood by mowing and cleaning next to the fences on 18th street, maintaining T.C. Jester esplanade trees and signs, and maintaining neighborhood entry markers;
- enhance neighborhood security through Citizen Patrol;
- enforce deed restrictions and architectural review of home renovations and construction;
- work with Super Neighborhood Council 14 and other city and county entities to ensure our neighborhood is maintained and improved;
- keep residents current on information that affects our neighborhood;
- form committees for yard-of-the-month, holiday judging, and bayou litter pick-ups etc.


Beautification Update

2022 was a busy year for beautification and maintenance efforts!

We completed a full replacement of two of our esplanade signs on WTC Jester that were in a complete state of disrepair and rot. We are happy to say that the new ones are installed and look fantastic!

Our metal work signs and brick walls along 18th Street were in desperate need of repair and re-coating. The work is now complete and the newly powder coated signs have been installed.

Our TC Jester Esplanade was long over due for a major pruning, it was looking unkempt and messy to say the least. After working with the COH and Urban Forestry, we were able to acquire the permits to do a major pruning of all the ornamental tress between 610 and Ella Blvd. Things are looking much improved!



2023 will bring fresh plants and mulch to our WTC Jester signs landscaping!

We hope to utilize our relationship with Urban Forestry, Trees for Houston and potentially the neighborhood matching grants program to fund and complete the planting of some large species native hardwoods along with irrigation in 2023 for some of the more sparse looking areas, for example, the section of esplanade between Lazybrook Dr and Brooktree Dr.

Lorraine Cherry Nature Preserve News

Fall was wonderful at the nature preserve. The leaves on the trees changed into beautiful hues of gold and rust that contrasted delightfully with the bright blue fall sky. And, if there was a breeze, the leaves fell in showers around anyone who happened to be fortunate enough to be standing there. The resulting leaf litter created another new forest carpet just before the winter months set in as we watched.

Not only is leaf litter uniquely beautiful each year, the leaf litter in our forest acts as a protective layer for soil conditions. It creates a physical barrier between the soil surface and atmosphere that reduces soil drying, responds to atmospheric temperature fluctuations, and reduces erosion from precipitation events. Through decomposition, nutrients stored in the dead material re-enter the system and act as a natural fertilizer for plants throughout the year. The controls and nutrient cycling are especially important for our forest wildflowers.

If you'd like to learn more about leaf litter, click on <u>Carnegie Museum of Natural History</u> or <u>Scientific American</u> for some easy to read, fascinating articles.

Bird Walks in the Forest resume on Tuesday mornings at 8:00 am on January 10. Check out the white board in the "Bird Nerd" area at the kiosk to see what has been sighted lately. Join us on any Tuesday morning at 8:00 am at the kiosk across from the corner of Shelterwood and Pineshade. Wear comfortable shoes, bring bug spray, and bring your binoculars if you have them.

Evening Bird Walks return on February 2, March 2, April 6, and May 4 at 5:30 also meeting at the kiosk. After the Evening Bird Walks, our new sponsor, Eureka Heights Brewery, is offering us a "Bird Walk Special" pricing for a beer or seltzer on tap. They have a food truck on Thursday evenings, so dinner is available as well.

Did you realize the Nature Preserve has "hours?" The nature preserve, like most Houston City Park spaces, is open from dawn to dusk. If you see flashlights or other lighting as you are driving by at night, please help us by making a phone call or sending an email to alert the Park Rangers. The contact information for the City of Houston Park Rangers is: 832-395askparks@houstontx.gov. 7000, It's important to say something if you see something for everyone's safety. If you are concerned during the daytime for any reason, please use the same contact information to let the Park Rangers know that something isn't right at the nature preserve. If you can't get a hold of anyone and you think something needs attention immediately, call 311 day or night and they will put you in touch with the right person.


us for the following free events this spring semester:
